THE FEAST OF THE HOLY ROSARY, OCTOBER 7

We enter once again into the month dedicated to the Holy Rosary. This year the month of October is a special one. As you know, Fr. Fullerton has launched a new Rosary Crusade to beg our Lady's powerful intercession for our country as we approach the November elections. Never was the call to prayer more urgent. But, remember, too, that no more powerful weapon could have been placed in our hands—the Rosary! As an encouragement to pray many fervent Rosaries during this month, let us consider the following words of Archbishop Marcel Lefebvre on the power of the Rosary as our spiritual weapon.

“We receive grace through prayer and more particularly through our good mother in Heaven. The Feast of the Holy Rosary recalls the struggles of the Blessed Virgin against the enemies of the Church.

“The Blessed Virgin wanted to manifest her presence in the Holy Church throughout history, alongside those who fought to maintain the Catholic Faith. She manifested her presence through the proclamation of her divine maternity against the Arians. She also manifested it through St. Dominic. Thanks to the recitation of the exceptional prayer of the Rosary, the Albigensians were vanquished. A little later, again upon the occasion of the feast of the holy Rosary, the Church invoked the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary to obtain the victory at Lepanto against the Muslims. Thanks to the prayers of the Rosary, it was also she who chased the Muslims from Hungary during the time of Pope Clement XI in 1716...

“We should also mention that the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared at Lourdes, La Salette, and Fatima, all during the modern era to fight against errors, particularly to fight against modernism and Communism. She said so explicitly...

“The Rosary is our weapon. It must be our weapon against the devil, against Satan. The magnificent examples produced through the recitation of the Rosary throughout history, obliges you to recite it often, and if you are able, even the entire Rosary. Entrust yourself to the Blessed Virgin Mary.

“I hope that all of you keep your rosary with you, and that you will recite it every day and pray to the mother of Heaven to keep you within the Catholic Faith. When you find yourself in temptation, when you are feeling discouraged amidst your difficulties, during trials, take out your rosary and pray it. Ask the Virgin Mary, our good mother in Heaven, to come to your rescue and you will see how the Rosary is an efficacious prayer. The Most Holy Virgin, in her apparitions, always comes with a rosary in her hand, showing us in that way how much she cares about this prayer.


